Thank you for your ongoing support. Together, we are making a meaningful impact and empowering individuals to create brighter futures.

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
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Organization Overview

We empower individuals to access education, healthcare and economic opportunities through life-changing bicycles.

- **Vision:** ABC Impact envisions a healthier, happier, better-educated, and more prosperous Tanzania utilizing bicycles for transport, sports, health, employment, environment, and leisure.
- **Mission:** ABC Impact empowers individuals to access education, healthcare, and economic opportunities through life-changing bicycles. We accomplish our mission through six programs.



Our Programs

1.Bike2School: A program that focuses on reducing the long-distance challenges faced by students in rural areas. Currently, the program helps both girls and boys through the distribution of bicycles, maintenance services, awareness campaigns, and the establishment of bicycle clubs in schools.





2.Youth Bike Academy: Develops young cycling talents from the streets to become professional cyclists of tomorrow through theoretical and practical training every Saturday.

Our Programs

- **3.Community Bike Forum:** Brings awareness of the benefits of cycling through monthly fun rides and an annual bicycle festival, the Impact Bike Festival.
- **4.Bikepreneur:** Creates capacities for youth in bicycle mechanic skills, entrepreneurship, and innovation.
- **5.Bikes4Trees:** Aims to combat climate change by promoting the use of bicycles as a means of transportation for community members during tree planting activities. Currently, this program operates in Kahe, Kilimanjaro.
- **6.Bikes4Change makers:** A program aimed at addressing long-distance challenges by tackling four critical needs in rural communities: Education, shelter, healthcare, and permaculture.

1.Launching Event for Bike2School in Kilimanjaro

On April 15, 2024, we successfully launched the Bike2School Program in the Kilimanjaro region at Mpirani Secondary School.

The event was honored to have the Mabogini Ward Councilor as the guest of honor, alongside representatives from the Regional Commissioner Police.

Attendees: The event was attended by representatives from five schools impacted by our Bike2School program: Mabogini, KIA Day, TPC, Oria, and Mpirani Secondary School.

We also welcomed parents and local stakeholders, contributing to a total of 500 attendees. Our Chief Impact Director, Ms. Ayanna Kimaro, led the ABC Impact team at this event.







Launching Event for Bike2School in Kilimanjaro

Impact:

The event resulted in the distribution of **300** bicycles to five schools (Mpirani, Mabogini, TPC, KIA Day, and Oria Secondary Schools), enabling students to attend school regularly.

We appreciate the cooperation from media outlets such as ITV Tanzania, Clouds FM, and local radios in Kilimanjaro for helping to communicate the impact of this event.

The presence of our partner, Velafrica, was instrumental in ensuring the event's success.







2. New Partnership with So They Can Organization

In May 2024, we established a new partnership with So They Can organization to enhance our Bike2School program.

We launched this program in Manyara, distributing bicycles to support local students.

We were honored to host the District Director of Babati as the guest of honor, along with the Country Director of So They Can Tanzania, Mrs. Roselyne Mariki, Impact Manager Mohammed Mussa, teachers, So They Can community parents, local leaders, and students.



New Partnership with So They Can Organization

Impact:

We officially started our Bike2School program in Manyara, distributing 100 bicycles to five schools: Mamire High School, Endakiso, Ayatsea, Qash, and Galapo Secondary Schools.

Due to the high demand, we added another 50 bicycles, bringing the total to 150 distributed in Manyara. We will implement a maintenance phase to ensure the bicycles remain in good condition and continue to benefit the students.


We organized a fun ride, starting from the Regional offices and covering 20 kilometers, ending at the Gymkhana grounds, where education on drug abuse was provided.




5. Victories for YBA Champions

- Paskal Meshack secured 2nd runner and David Festo secured 3rd runner in the 10 km race.








6. Growing and Involving

Challenges and Learning

Challenges

- In promoting awareness about our mission and impact, especially through the Bike2School program, we decided to hold a launch event. However, we faced financial challenges in organizing the event and supporting the community with bicycles at the same time.
- As we aim to take our Youth Bike Academy (YBA)
 champions to competitions and expose them to
 bicycle racing, we are encountering a shortage of
 essential cycling equipment, particularly racing
 bicycles and cycling shoes.

Learning

- Expanding Partnerships: To enhance lives through bicycles in Tanzania, we should focus on extending our network of partners who can join us in various initiatives, amplifying our impact.
- Equipment Needs for Competitions: The shortage
 of cycling tools for our Youth Bike Academy
 champions highlighted the importance of securing
 necessary resources in advance. It showed us that
 stronger collaborations with cycling brands,
 sponsors, and donors are crucial to ensure our
 athletes have the right tools for success in
 competitive environments.




Rahma's Story: A student at Mamire Sec


